INFORMATION SHEET

Wood Village is a suburban community in the eastern Portland metropolitan area and is located along I-84, and is the gateway to the Mt. Hood Scenic Byway. Wood Village also leads to the scenic Columbia River Gorge. Wood Village began as Oregon's first planned community, being built in 1941 to provide housing for those employed at the nearby aluminum plant during World War II.

CITY GOVERNMENT

On February 9, 1951 the residents of Wood Village voted to incorporate as a new city. The City is governed by a five-member City Council whose members are volunteers and elected to four-year terms on a staggered basis. The Council selects one of its members to serve as Mayor for a two-year term. Regular City Council meetings are held once each month on the second Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. in City Hall.

Daily operations of the City are supervised by a City Administrator who reports directly to the Council and Mayor. Services provided by the City of Wood Village include water, sanitary and storm sewer, street maintenance, street lighting, planning and zoning, building permits, parks and community events. The City contracts with Multnomah County Sheriff's Office for law enforcement services. Fire service is provided through a contract with the City of Gresham. The City has licensed Waste Management of Oregon for garbage collection and recycling services.

CITY FACILITIES

Water System

Streets

- 4.24 miles of City streets.
- All paved and curbed.
- All on storm sewer system.
- Maintained by the City of Wood Village.
- Street sweeping contracted with Multnomah County.
- (Sandy Blvd., 238th, Halsey, Arata, Wood Village Blvd., 244th, & Glisan are owned and maintained by Multnomah County).

City Hall Building and Land

Purchased in 1951 with a bond issue for \$12,500.

Park

The 21 acre Donald L. Robertson City Park is maintained by the City of Wood Village.

The park includes basketball hoops, playground equipment, picnic tables and a picnic pavilion, benches, exercise trails, a viewpoint, softball fields, soccer fields, restroom facilities and an arboretum.

In August 1959, 3 acres of the park property were purchased with private donations, a percentage of business sales receipts, and donations by the Wood Village Booster's Club. Multnomah County deeded an additional 5.5 acres to the City in 1987 for softball and soccer fields. The major portion of park development on the 8.5 acres was funded by State and Federal grants.

In February 1996 the City purchased a 6.8 acre parcel of property from Multnomah County to expand the park. This property connects the original park with a 5.5 acre City owned parcel near Treehill and Cottonwood Condominiums. The addition of these two properties resulted in a park of nearly 21 acres.
